Dear Parents and Carers,

Is it too early to be talking about Christmas? Due to the Government guidelines, we have had to take the difficult decision this year not to do any nativity plays or concerts. Obviously at the moment parents would not be able to come into the school building and we would not be able to have more than one year group in the hall, but Christmas is not cancelled! Staff, backed by our wonderful PTA, are determined to make this year as special as we can so we have lots of different events planned. We are hoping to put our tree up outside this year so all our children can see it, we plan to observe Christmas Jumper Day, we are planning Santa/reindeer runs around the playground, we are going to have a 'Dec the Hale day' where children decorate their classrooms. Step 1: Join Amazon Smile

If you aren't already an AmazonSmile member, sign up at smile.amazon.com or via https://smile.amazon.co.uk/ch/1167294-0 using a web browser (mobile or desktop). You'll sign in with your Amazon credentials, and the site will walk you through the process.

You will be asked for the charity you wish to support – search for Hale Pta (be careful not to pick Hale Parent Teachers Association as this is linked to another school!).

Step 2: To shop via the mobile app: open the Amazon Shopping App on your phone. If you don't already have the app, download it from the Apple App store or Google Play.

Step 3: Open settings within the app.

Open settings by tapping the three horizontal lines at the top left and tapping Settings.

Step 4: Tap Amazon Smile (if you cannot see this option, you may need to re-install the app on your phone).

Step 5: Tap the button for "Turn on Amazon Smile"

You'll need to follow the three-step set up process. Note that Amazon requires you to turn on notifications to be able to use AmazonSmile on your phone.

Step 6: Confirm that Amazon Smile is active before your next purchase

Look for AmazonSmile at the top of the app as you browse. You'll also see your chosen charity on the confirmation screen.

Can I use my existing amazon.co.uk account on Amazon Smile?

Yes, you use the same account on amazon.co.uk and AmazonSmile. Your shopping cart, wish list and other account settings are also the same.

A Cold or Coronavirus?

When should I keep my child at home?

My child is feeling unwell with

a runny nose, a sore throat, or is sneezing but they don't have

· a high temperature

(two readings over 37.8°C in a four hour period)

• a new, continuous cough

(observed over a period of an hour)

a loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste



These are not normally symptoms of coronavirus

Seek advice from a pharmacy, dial 111 or see your GP

Your child can attend school

Consider giving them some paracetamol or ibuprofen to make them feel a bit better

My child has

· a high temperature

(two readings over 37.8°C in a four hour period)

a new, continuous cough

(observed over a period of an hour)

a loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste



This could be a sign of coronavirus

Do not send your child to school

Arrange a test

Everyone in your household must self-isolate

Children should only return to school once they have received a negative test result or 10 days after they first showed symptoms

If anybody else in your household has any of these symptoms, do not send your child to school

Follow the PHE guidance

If your child displays any of the above symptoms whilst in school, you will be asked to collect your child.

You should then arrange a test and self-isolate according to the PHE guidance
