Reading

The children will finish reading Journey to the Riversea and then begin Clockwork by Philip Pullman. This is a suspenseful fairy tale involving a tormented apprentice clock-maker and a deadly knight in armour. The children will

continue to develop their comprehension skills through Careful analysis and discussion of the text.



Writing

This term, the children will be starting another new writing unit, following the story of The Nightmare Man, and creating our own suspense narratives. The children will have a chance to practise their skills on creating suspense and put into action all of the

descriptive tools we have given them in the previous half term. We are really excited to see which stories they come up with!

<u>Maths</u>

In spring 2, the children will begin to deepen their year 4 learning on perimeter and area as they apply their learning look at compound shapes. Following this, the children will learn about various types of graphs and tables. These include line graphs, two-way tables and timetables. Finally, the children will begin drawing angles of certain degrees.



<u>Science</u>

In science, the children will be learning about Earth and space. We will learn about the movements of planets and the Moon. The children will be able to explain how day and

night occurs before studying notable scientists who, throughout history, have impacted our understanding.



<u>RE</u>

This half term our RE lessons will focus on the connections between religion and art. The children will examine the way in which different religions have influenced art by exploring symbolism, the use of art in places of worship and the stories that are told through artworks.

<u>Geography</u>

In geography the children will look in more detail at the Amazon Rainforest. We will learn about deforestation and its effects on the Amazon Rainforest.. The children will answer

our big question: 'What are the different effects of deforestation on the Amazon Rainforest?'





This half term's PE is athletics. The children will be learning how to improve their performance in track and field sports. The training will help to develop their strength, technique and control. Sprint starts, long jump and throwing techniques will also be taught.



<u>Music</u>

We are excited to start our weekly music lessons this half term. The children will be listening and responding to a variety of songs including some 20th century orchestral pieces and some gospel. With a particular focus on melody and harmony, the children will use instruments and their vocal skills to learn and perform some songs with each other.

<u>PSHE</u>

This half-term, the children will be looking at the topic of finance. The children will explore the important role finance plays in people's lives, what it means to be a critical consumer and how to keep track of money. The children will also look at loans



French

This term, the children will be starting a unit on 'ma famille' (my family)! Each class will slowly build a fictional family that the children will be able to describe in a moderate amount of detail. Feel free to test their knowledge at home by

asking the children which family member they learned about that week.
